JOSEPH J. SCHAMRIS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Joe was diagnosed with polio at a young age and had as many as eleven surgeries on his legs as a child. He worked in the woodworking industry for 25 years while being constricted with polio. He was self-employed and owned his own shop, Joe Schamris Cabinet Shop. He was a family man and married the love of his life, Caroline in 1952. They had three daughters, Paula, Janice and Jolie, he had 14 grandchildren and 17 great-grandchildren. While an instructor at the GACTC not only did he teach his student the art of woodworking, he also taught them about LIFE. The Blair County Home Builders founded the Joseph J. Schamris Scholarship in memory of "Sep", who passed away after a brief illness in 2017, he was 88.
